



Beaverton School District (Beaverton) — \$10,000

to provide opportunities for students with autism and their neurotypical peers to interact during cooperative group sports, social activities and games

Care To Share (Beaverton) — \$14,000

to provide coordinated help to families seeking emergency food by taking requests by phone and providing scheduled referral appointments to nearby food distribution partners

Centro Cultural of Washington County (Cornelius) — \$10,000

to support the YES program, developing leadership skills for at-risk middle school students in the context of sports, classroom discussions and community service

Chess For Success (Portland) — \$9,000

to teach students critical thinking, social skills and sportsmanship through the game of chess

The Circus Project (Portland) — \$15,000

to provide circus arts training for 150 homeless and at-risk youth, creating therapeutic environments to develop life skills and personal integrity

Community Cycling Center (Portland) — \$18,000

to support three semesters of Bike Club in two N/NE Portland elementary schools, providing youth with bikes and bike safety education

Friends of Baseball (Portland) — \$15,000

to address the equity and accessibility issues experienced by underserved NW Oregon youth who wish to participate in youth baseball and softball team programs

Friends of the Children - Portland (Portland) — \$10,000

to support specialized adolescent programming and organizational capacity building to serve more children

Girls Inc. of Northwest Oregon (Portland) — \$10,000

to create a non-competitive, exploratory environment for girls to develop skills for lifelong physical fitness and activity



Gladstone School District #115 (Gladstone) — \$17,000

to support Physical Activity (PLAY), a program educating the community about ways to incorporate PLAY as a means to promote healthy lifestyles

GLSEN Oregon (Beaverton) — \$14,000

to support two trainings for K-12 coaches and physical education teachers on making athletics inclusive of all students, regardless of their sexual orientation or gender identity

Kukatonon Children's African Dance Troupe (Portland) — \$5,000

for schoolchildren from disadvantaged populations to learn African dances in their traditional forms and gain a broader understanding of cultural diversity

Morrison Child & Family Services (Portland) — \$5,000

for soccer equipment, training and coaching for at-risk and indigent boys to inspire teamwork, cooperation and sportsmanship

Neighborhood House, Inc. (Portland) — \$20,000

for CASASTART, a school-based program for at-risk youth to improve school attendance, academic success and increase parent engagement

Northeast Community Center (Portland) — \$9,000

to develop a youth basketball league and mentorship program with half of 120 slots reserved for foster children

Northwest Association for Blind Athletes (Vancouver) — \$8,000

to provide opportunities for individuals with visual impairments to participate in sports and physical activity

Northwest Children's Outreach (Lake Oswego) — \$5,000

to support a collection and distribution center where individuals and families can contribute basic needs items such as clothing, shoes, diapers and hygiene supplies for children in their neighborhood

p:ear (Portland) — \$10,000

to provide outdoor recreational opportunities for homeless youth to experience relaxation, personal growth, confidence and play beyond the limits of their urban context



Pathfinders of Oregon (Portland) — \$8,000

to implement a physical play and nutrition program where young parents (ages 14-21) and their children (ages 0-5) improve health and develop parent-child bonding

Pendulum Aerial Arts (Portland) — \$6,000

to encourage creativity, personal growth and physical fitness for Portland youth, particularly pre-teen and teenage girls, through training in the aerial arts

Peninsula Children's Center (Portland) — \$10,000

to renovate and weatherize the current play area to help preschool children develop gross motor skills through physical exercise

Playworks (Portland) — \$20,000

to create safe, inclusive and positive environments during recess through play and physical activity in six Portland-Metro schools and 41 SUN Community schools by training teachers, coaches and support staff

Police Activities League of Greater Portland (Portland) — \$20,000

for low-income and at-risk children to attend summer day camp, offering sports, education and anti-gang programs at Portland State University

Portland Institute for Contemporary Art (Portland) — \$15,000

to provide youth access to arts and artists through hands-on participatory arts experiences, including dance workshops

Returning Veterans Resource Project NW (Portland) — \$6,000

to recruit more volunteers in order to meet the growing need for free counseling and healthcare services for Iraq and Afghanistan War veterans and their families

Willamette Pedestrian Coalition (Portland) — \$6,000

to support Walktober, a month-long walking series and walk challenge to encourage community members to explore walking as a social and active lifestyle choice

Your Community Mediators of Yamhill County (McMinnville) — \$5,000

to strengthen and expand the Juvenile Victim Offender Mediation Program throughout Yamhill County, in cooperation with schools, juvenile justice workers and social service agencies
