

Agape House (Hermiston) — \$10,000

for transport equipment and a storage structure for non-food item donations for low-income area residents

Albany Community After-School Program (Albany) — \$18,000

to increase affordable childcare in the community by opening two additional sites

Assistance League of Salem (Salem) — \$20,000

to provide clothing and hygiene supplies for low-income, at-risk children in the Salem/Keizer School District, attending the Chemawa Indian School, and participating in Head Start programs

The Black United Fund of Oregon, Inc. (Portland) — \$25,000

to develop the new individual donor program into a sustainable and growing revenue source

Boys & Girls Aid Society of Oregon (Portland) — \$33,000

for support of Mentor Portland, a one-on-one mentoring program that focuses on at-risk youth who are in foster care, have a parent incarcerated, and/or have family members involved in the criminal justice system

Boys and Girls Club of Lebanon (Lebanon) — \$35,000

to implement a satellite after-school program for children grades 1-8 attending Hamilton Creek and Lacombe schools

to launch and support a four-year capacity-building project to stabilize core operating funding

to build capacity through the hiring of a development director
