

**4 Worlds United Soccer Alliance (Portland) - \$10,000**

to increase opportunities for immigrant and refugee youth to play on integrated soccer teams as a way of improving self-esteem, social integration and learning attitude.

Beaverton Education Foundation (Beaverton) - \$5,000

to provide financial assistance and volunteer coaching for Aloha area low-income and at-risk student participation in Girls on the Run at multiple neighborhood schools.

Beaverton PAL (Police Activities League) (Beaverton) - \$20,000

to teach youth discipline, respect and teamwork through the art of boxing while building their self-esteem and providing them a safe outlet under positive adult supervision.

Central City Concern (Portland) - \$20,000

to create a safe, inclusive, and environmentally-friendly outdoor play area for children who reside with their mothers being treated for addictions at the Letty Owings Center.

Children's Healing Art Project (Portland) - \$7,000

to bring the healing power of art to more children and families through program expansion at Doernbecher Children's Hospital.

Daniel A. Grout Elementary School PTA (Portland) - \$7,000

for phase 3 of a four-year field makeover (started in 2009) at Grout Elementary School. Phases 1 and 2 are complete.

Eagle Creek Elementary (Eagle Creek) - \$7,000

to create a safe environment that encourages positive, creative and active play for the students and community in Eagle Creek.

Friends of Zenger Farm (Portland) - \$15,000

to expand an existing program that equips underserved families with the education, skills and tools needed to access and prepare fresh, healthy meals on a limited budget.

Hacienda Community Development Corporation (Portland) - \$15,000

to provide soccer and nutrition programming for students in the Expresiones After School Program by utilizing Hacienda's newly constructed Futsal court.

Impact NW (Portland) - \$7,000

to provide 60 at-risk students at Barnes Elementary with healthy physical activity and positive adult role models.

**Momentum Alliance (Portland) - \$10,000**

to provide support for physical activities and healthy lifestyle skills development during Student Alliance Project's Winter, Spring and Summer Leadership Camps.

Native American Youth and Family Center (Portland) - \$15,000

to create an innovative after-school recreation program while teaching youth the essentials of health and wellness based on a culturally specific service delivery model.

Northwest Dance Project (Portland) - \$9,000

to promote lifelong physical fitness and activity by providing interactive dance education activities to disadvantaged youth in the Portland metro region.

Oregon Disability Sports (Portland) - \$10,000

to create a level playing field by providing a sports program for youth with disabilities.

Oregon School Activities Association (Wilsonville) - \$10,000

to assist high school students who cannot afford necessary equipment, clothing or shoes to participate in extra-curricular activities.

Playworks (Portland) - \$20,000

to improve school climate & increase the physical/emotional health of Portland area kids in low-income schools through inclusive and positive recesses and intramural sports.

Pleasant Valley Elementary School (Gresham) - \$10,000

to enhance a recreational trail network at Pleasant Valley School, providing student, family and community access, increasing recreation onsite, while protecting habitat.

Portland Public Schools District (Portland) - \$20,000

to introduce a new play environment at Whitman School, where all children can be active, imaginative, and encourage health and play as part of their learning environment.

Resolutions Northwest (Portland) - \$20,000

to reduce disproportionate minority student referrals for school discipline and to juvenile justice by disrupting traditional exclusionary discipline practices.

Rose City Rollers (Portland) - \$9,000

to expand a successful roller derby outreach program focused on reducing the barriers to participation in roller derby for at-risk teen girls.
