for the ACCESS Walker Emergency Fund, helping families in crisis with unexpected financial emergencies

ACCESS, Inc. (Medford) — \$50,000

for the ACCESS Food Share Program, helping individuals and families in need with emergency food

The Arc of Jackson County (Medford) — \$3,000

to provide emergency financial assistance to people with developmental disabilities (DD) and their families

Arts Council of Southern Oregon (Medford) — \$14,820

for the Lithia Springs School music education program, enhancing the healing process for adjudicated teens through music and lyric composition, accompaniment and performance
