to provide learning experiences for families in science, art, and culture

**All Classical Public Media, Inc. (Portland) — \$30,000**

for capital upgrades to office and studio space in order to move into the Hampton Opera Center in SE Portland

**All Hands Raised / Portland Schools Foundation (Portland) — \$25,000**

to manage and sustain the Cradle to Career partnership, designed to connect systems serving children from prenatal care through young adulthood, so that by age 25 they are self-sufficient and earning a living wage

**The Arc of Jackson County (Medford) — \$3,000**

to provide emergency financial assistance to people with intellectual & developmental disabilities, and their families
