<p><b>La Clinica</b> for the first of three years' potential funding to provide dental health education through the Happy Smiles program in 26 Medford School District schools and in the community</p>	Medford	\$ 115,000
<p><b>Maslow Project</b> for the first year of three years' potential funding to provide integrated support services for homeless Jackson County youth and their parents/guardians</p>	Medford	\$ 85,000
<p><b>Medford School District 549C</b> for year one of three years' potential funding for Project Dove, an intervention and prevention program for students in elementary, middle, and high schools within the Medford School District designed to keep at-risk students and out of the juvenile justice system</p>	Medford	\$ 35,000
<p><b>Phoenix Counseling Center, Inc.</b> for year one of two years' potential funding to provide counseling, substance use treatment groups to increase mother-child attachment and support for pregnant women and new moms at risk for substance abuse</p>	Phoenix	\$ 70,000

<b>The Family Nurturing Center</b> for the third and final year of potential funding to sustain services that strengthen protective factors in families, prioritizing positive social connection and concrete support in the form of therapeutic group work, case management and home visiting services, and increased access to locally grown nutritious foods	Medford	\$ 90,000
<b>The Family Nurturing Center</b> for year one of three years' potential funding for the expansion of mental health services for children and at-risk families	Medford	\$ 95,160
<b>United Way of Jackson County</b> for one year of potential funding for the Oasis Center pilot project providing family-centered treatment bringing together existing services to create a system that addresses high risk, high need families caught in addiction, abuse, child neglect, poverty and other conditions threatening the well-being of children and parents	Medford	\$ 100,000
