to assist homeless families in crisis by helping them move into affordable housing or keep people in their current homes by assisting them with past-due rent or utility bills before they are evicted

to support the Listo family literacy program, providing school readiness in a culturally and developmentally appropriate environment for children 0-5-year-old; multi-level homework classes for students ages 6-15; ESL instruction; GED and INEA-Spanish basic literacy classes for parents
