### HONORING EXCELLENCE—A LEGACY



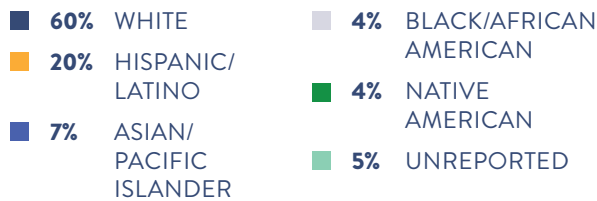
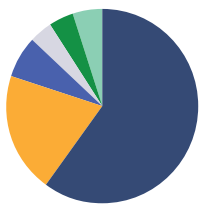
Thanks to the generosity of thousands of donors, OCF awards scholarships from more than 500 scholarship funds. One of these funds is the Kevin MacMillan Scholarship,

which is awarded annually to a Grant High School graduating senior. The award is made in the memory of Kevin MacMillan, who demonstrated excellence in academic, athletic, and community involvement during his school years and passed away in 1981. Kevin's brother, Steve MacMillan, presented the 2018 scholarship recipient, Damon Hickok, with a certificate at Grant High School's award ceremony. Damon later learned that his uncle knew Kevin MacMillan and went head-to-head with Kevin in football and basketball.



## RACE AND ETHNICITY

OCF is committed to closing this opportunity gap, and OCF scholarships are mitigating these inequities. 35% of OCF scholarship recipients identify as non-white, and 39% are considered low-income.

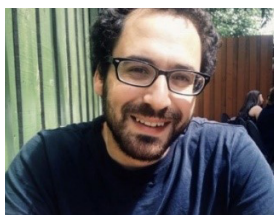
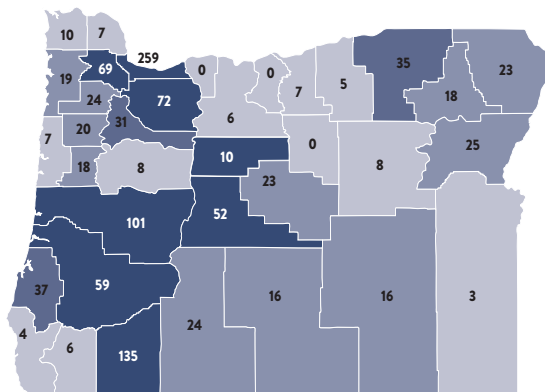
