

St. Andrew's Society Scholarship Criteria

An applicant for a St. Andrew's Society Scholarship must be a graduating high school senior from Oregon or Clark County, Washington AND applicants must be one of the following:

- I. Born in Scotland,
- 2. The child or grandchild or someone born in Scotland,
- 3. Someone who has demonstrated substantial commitment to Highland dancing, piping, drumming, or playing the Celtic harp or the Highland fiddle.

An applicant for a St. Andrew's Scholarship on the basis of having demonstrated a substantial commitment to Highland dancing, piping or drumming must meet the following criteria:

- For piping or drumming is ranked at Grade 3 or higher by the British Columbia Pipers' Society
 or other recognized sanctioning organization. For Highland dancing has reached the Premier
 level as recognized by the Scottish Official Board of Highland Dance.
- 2. Has pursued regular instruction their art form through the end of high school.
- Has demonstrated intent to reach beyond regular instruction by participating in workshops to advance skill levels.
- 4. Has positioned him/herself to excel in the art form by seeking challenges including competitive opportunities of the highest possible standard.
- 5. Can list competitive achievements gained regionally, nationally and internationally.
- 6. Has given back to the art form through leadership, continued support of organizations in the local Scottish community, and sharing time and talents.

An applicant for a St. Andrew's Scholarship on the basis of having demonstrated a substantial commitment to playing the Celtic harp or the Highland fiddle must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Has pursued regular instruction in their art form through the end of high school.
- Has demonstrated intent to reach beyond regular instruction by participating in workshops to advance skill levels.
- 3. Produces a written recommendation from their instructor detailing commitment to the art.
